

Konko-Sama' Speech

"A Mother and a Father were born with their newborn baby. They should all grow up together."

The fourth Konko-sama made this poem when he had his first grandson. As he prayed to be a good grandfather, his first grandson succeeded his position as the sixth Konko-sama. Thus, the Founder's faith continued in Konko-sama's family. Referring to this poem, the present Konko-sama shared his thoughts – the importance of being aware of the favor that we received and responding to the favor.

y grandfather, who had served for Kyoshu (patriarch) of Konkokyo, was a poet. Studying under his mentor, Kubota Utsubo, he enjoyed composing waka poems. Over forty thousand of his waka poems were compiled in a book of 19 volumes. He created a poem when I was born in 1966.

My grandfather wrote: "I was happy when my grandson was born. I became much happier when I thought that a mother, a father, a grandmother, and a grandfather were born simultaneously. Thus, I made a poem: 'A Mother and a Father were born with their newborn baby. They should all grow up together.' It would be nice if all parents thought in this way. However, many parents want a good, studious child. This is the parents' desire which hinders their child. When



their child becomes one year old, they also become one year old parents. Thus, the parents must be willing to grow as their child grows.

When their child turns one year older, the parents get one year older. They try to understand the child well and strive to be a suitable parent for the child. The parents should work hard with their child. Someday, the child will realize

the parents' behavior, and the child will grow by learning from the parents."

My grandfather prayed for my parents to learn and grow together as parents and son.

I have three children right now. With their birth, we were able to be their parents. When our first child was born, we felt that we entered a "School for both parents and child". They say, "Only after becoming a parent yourself you realize how indebted you are to your own parents." I truly feel this every day.

To my grandfather's prayer and to my parents' favor, if I could repay their favor, I would like to learn and grow with my child.

As my child got older, I once served as the PTA officer for the kindergarten. While I was helping with the activities, I thought about the PTA officers

who took care of me in my kindergarten, elementary school, and junior high school. I then realized that I had an opportunity to return the favor by serving as the PTA officer.



Favors and kindness that you received may have happened a long time ago, and you tend to forget them. However, so many people have taken care of me in so many ways. I realized that I had forgotten many of them. This was a great opportunity to be aware of the favor that I received in the past.

For example, society would fail if I did not want to or did

not get involved in raising a child or partake in the PTA activities. We should remember the favor that we received. I think identifying and acting upon the favor are important. I will have more opportunities to realize the favor that I received. I wish that I could realize more favors, and I pray that I could act on those favors.

We are living in a world that cannot be defined as peaceful. Now, I have a family, and I feel as if Kami-sama said, "The peace of the

world starts with peace in our family." As we are all allowed to live in the Tenchi Universe, let us value each other, live together, and be saved together. While thinking of those who are suffering from war, hunger, poverty, and disease, let us, all the people in the world, live

together and be saved together as Kami's children transcending differences in nationality, race, language, and religion. Let us pray for the peace and prosperity of the world.

ot long after I came to Sacramento, a woman, who visited the church for the first time, came straight to the Mediation. While holding back her tears,

she said, "I heard that my brother came here yesterday requesting for my mother's recovery. My mother is currently unconscious. Her doctor told us that she will not get better. However, if my mother passes away now, I will never be able to exhibit my love and respect to her." Motivated by her earnest, I faced the altar. I

felt death lingering closely to the mother. I thought, "What should I do? I cannot offer any teachings to her unconscious mother. There is nothing that I can do." Right at that moment, I subconsciously stated, "I, Konko Daijin of Sacramento, pray to you, Tenchi Kane no Kami." Then, I felt in my heart the words, "Three days."

Three days later, the mother woke up from a coma and was able to leave the hospital. Perhaps the woman who came to pray and the toritsugi mediator were able to make a request together to Kami, and Konko Daijin appeared at the Hiromae, mediation hall.

When our current spiritual leader, Konkosama, was serving as the Director of the Mediation Hall Department in Honbu, the Headquarter, he interpreted the phrase "Working locally while thinking globally" as "Do what you can in your immediate vicinity but look at the bigger picture." In other words, he

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believes that his task is to "currently practice faith" in the vast universe. From his expression, he shows his determination to follow our Founder's words, "Kami will act in your

stead."

This is a recollection from Kunieda Sangoro. The Founder told Kunieda, who later became known as the Konjin of Otoshima, "Sangoro, while you concern yourself with only trivial things, I am aspiring for a blessing which will completely embrace the world with this Faith." And "Practice

To this, Kunieda replied, "Of course I will practice faith. You aimed for and attained goals you could not see in the beginning. Since I hope to become like you, I will practice faith." With these teachings, Kunieda received blessings.

Kunieda expressed the Founder's faith as "aiming for and attained goals you could not see in the beginning." Similar to how Kunieda hopes to become like the Founder, our goal is Konko-sama's determination to "currently practice faith".

As Konko-sama stated on his 58th birthday, let us express our appreciation for the blessings bestowed upon us, apologize irreverence and shortcoming, renew our heart, and pray for the world peace and salvation of humanity now and forever on this very day.
